Focus Area - Organizations That Help Prevent Child Abuse, Neglect & Violence

The *Child Protective Services* (CPS) branch of California's *Department of Children & Family Services* is responsible for assessing, investigating and intervening in cases of child abuse and neglect, including sexual abuse. The CPS protects children from caregivers who may be causing harm or allowing dangerous living conditions.

Covenant House, located in Oakland, Santa Clara, Los Angeles, Anaheim, and other cities in the United States, has been operating for more than 50 years. This privately-funded agency provides shelter, food, immediate crisis care, and related services to homeless youth ages 14-20; helping to ease the transition from homelessness to independent adulthood. Though **Covenant House** provides much in the way of assistance, providing healthy meals may be the most important of all. Severe hunger is dangerously detrimental to one's mental health and well-being. When a youth working to overcome homelessness comes through their door, **Covenant House** makes sure a healthy and nutritious meal is available.
